


EBC is hiring a Policy Trainee!

In addition to how the EHDS can be used broadly for improvements in health care delivery, the audience is taken through how the EHDS can be used to support policy implementation- both through support of the WHO's 10-year Intersectoral Global Action plan on Epilepsy and Other Neurological Disorders (IGAP), relevant to all neurological conditions, and also for rare neurological conditions in support of the Rare 2030 Recommendations.
