EBC Invited to Address the European Parliament Public Health Committee

17th of October, European Parliament – The European Brain Council's (EBC) Vice-President, Prof. Claudio Bassetti, addressed the European Parliament Subcommittee on Public Health (SANT) meeting in Brussels on neurological health, presenting not only on the burden of neurological disorders but the increasing momentum around prioritising brain health and brain capital in Europe and beyond.

As Europe faces unprecedented challenges around brain health, EBC and its community have been rallying behind a call for increased attention to brain health, calling on Members of the European Parliament for urgent action to tackle the burden of brain disorders, neurological and mental alike, in the current mandate.

Calling for an Intergroup on Brain Health: Over 110 organisations and several MEPs have voiced support for stronger policy leadership and called for a dedicated EU Brain Health Plan and the establishment of a European Parliament Intergroup on Brain Health in the current mandate.




Davos Alzheimer's Collaborative Sounds Alarm on the Urgency of a Global Response to Alzheimer's, Calling on G7 Leaders to Move Swiftly

8th October, Ancona - The Davos Alzheimer's Collaborative (DAC), with the European Brain Council, the Global CEO Initiative on Alzheimer's Disease, the Associazione Italiana Malattia di Alzheimer and Fondazione Prada, issued an urgent call-to-action for G7 leaders to address the escalating global challenge of Alzheimer's and dementia by taking bold measures to ensure broad and equitable access to life-extending therapies and other current innovations.

DAC and all partners in the side event urged G7 governments to take the following actions to ensure that the benefits of scientific progress reach all patients:

- 1. Expand Global and Cross-Sector Collaboration
- 2. Invest in Healthcare System Preparedness
- 3. Build the Capabilities for Early Detection and Accurate Diagnosis
- 4. Accelerate the Development and Delivery of Alzheimer's Interventions
- 5. Foster Research, Access, and Equity Worldwide



Preserving the Brain: A Call to Action

The European Brain Council took part in the 'Preserving the Brain' scientific conference organised by Fondazione Prada on 16th and 17th of October in Milan, Italy. This event's focus was on the importance of prevention and early treatment of widespread and still incurable diseases, such as Alzheimer's, Huntington's, Parkinson's, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis, and Multiple Sclerosis.

Frйdйric Destrebecq, EBC's Executive Director, contributed to a roundtable discussion on priorities and future actions to be implemented in order to prevent neurodegenerative diseases.

EBC at XI Lausanne: Where Leaders Converge to End Alzheimer's Disease

The 2024 Lausanne Workshop was the eleventh annual Alzheimer's convening aimed at stopping Alzheimer's. Over the past decade, it has become a key platform for global stakeholders to identify challenges, set solutions, measure progress, and ensure accountability.

Organized by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and supported by the Global CEO Initiative on Alzheimer's Disease (CEOi), Alzheimer's Disease International (ADI) and World Economic Forum (WEF), the workshop began in 2014 following the UK G8 Dementia Summit's call to stop Alzheimer's by 2025, reinforced by the 2015 WHO Ministerial Conference.

EBC's Deputy Executive Director Stephanie Kramer participated in a panel titled "Preventative Power: Promoting Brain Health to Address the Alzheimer's Crisis".

EBC at the 2024 Congress of the European Association of Neurosurgical Societies

The European Brain Council had the chance to attend the <u>European Associations of Neurosurgical Societies 2024</u> Congress which was held from 13-17 October 2024 in Sofia (Bulgaria). This year, the theme was "Innovation, Education, Leadership", reflecting the current need to thoroughly discuss the future of neurosurgery in connection with technological advances that can improve neurosurgical education, training and treatment, aiming to create the next leaders of neurosurgery in Europe and all over the globe. EBC took part in a session titled "Building Brain Health in Europe". **Prof. Suzanne Dickson**, EBC President, presented the advocacy work in the brain space undertaken at the European level and explored the importance of the work currently being done. **Dr Ricardo Chavarriaga** explored the ethics of neuroprosthetics and looked into the development of government mechanisms for the use of technology (such as artificial intelligence and big data) to safeguard rights on mental privacy. Lastly, EBC was present at the Congress with a booth in the exhibition area, where we shared more information about ongoing projects, latest activities, and upcoming events! We are looking forward to next years' EANS congress, taking place from October 5 to 9 in Vienna!

The Second Phase of the Rethinking Schizophrenia Project Aims to Optimise the Schizophrenia Care Pathway

Schizophrenia has long been associated with the haunting echoes of voices, shaping public perceptions and treatment approaches alike. However, the essence of this condition extends far beyond the auditory hallucinations. It is a complex interplay of cognitive, emotional, and social dimensions that demands a holistic re-evaluation.

The European Brain Council's "Rethinking Schizophrenia: Beyond the Voices" is the first part of a research-driven project "Rethinking Schizophrenia", offering tangible policy and care pathway changes to improve the lives of people living with schizophrenia across Europe. It challenges the status quo and refreshes the European policy debate on people living with schizophrenia, recognises the essential role of social support and encourages multi-stakeholder-driven policy.

In the second part of the project, EBC together with the European Psychiatric Association, the Board of Experts and Patients Associations representatives will share how mental health services are addressing the needs of young individuals with first episode psychosis. Despite some positive developments, there are still many deficiencies along the schizophrenia care pathway in Europe. The results will be released in the Spring of 2025.

In light of World Mental Health Day, EBC Took Part in the Erasmus + "Sharing4employment" Webinar

On 11 October 2024, Vinciane Quoidbach, EBC's Research Project Manager, presented the second phase of the Rethinking Schizophrenia project led by EBC in collaboration with the European Psychiatric Association. Schizophrenia is a complex mental health condition identified as one of the 15 leading causes of disability globally. While an estimated 24 million people live with schizophrenia, approximately 7–8 individuals out of 1000 will be diagnosed in their lifetime. In Europe, schizophrenia affects 0.3–1.5% of the population. Despite the low prevalence, schizophrenia has a huge societal burden: often diagnosed between late adolescence and early adulthood, with later onset in women, it impacts every aspect of life, including relationships, education, and employment.

There is a need to improve prevention and care of young individuals with first episode psychosis (the onset of schizophrenia) to safely and effectively transition between various types of care tailored according to individual needs. The Rethinking Schizophrenia project is addressing these issues while looking at optimizing the care pathways to recovery.

Vinciane Quoidbach, EBC Research Project Manager, discussed the Aspire4Rare EU Action Plan in a panel discussion on rare diseases. This participation accompanies EBC's co-authorship to the Aspire4Rare Global Report. This action plan will be a significant milestone for people living with rare disorders, however, while the community continues to advocate for this vital progression there remains urgent work to be done.

Aspire4Rare proposes a Rare focussed health system framework with associated measurement approaches and good practice examples which can serve as a practical tool right now to support action on national policies such as rare disease strategies.

Exploring the Mysteries of the Brain with Steven Laureys at TheMerode in Brussels

EFNA at the WHO Forum: Shaping the Future of Neurology and Mental Health

The European Federation of Neurological Associations (EFNA) recently attended the WHO Forum in Geneva, where they engaged in extensive discussions with key stakeholders in the field of neurology.

In advance of the Forum, on Tuesday, October 8, Tadeusz Hawrot, EFNA's Senior Policy Advisor, represented EFNA at a meeting of WHO-affiliated non-state actors. This gathering held a significant promise for deepening civil society's role in the neurology landscape, creating new avenues for advocacy and collaboration.

On October 9, EFNA's representatives, together with Coriene Catsman-Berrevoets (Vice Chair, OneNeurology), participated in the WHO Mental Health Forum representing OneNeurology. This year's Forum was especially momentous, marking the first in-person assembly in Geneva in five years—since WHO began conceptualising the framework for 'brain health.'

On World Mental Health Day, October 10, Tadeusz Hawrot joined a panel representing OneNeurology. Discussions centered on implementing the global action plan on neurology, a key step in integrating neurological priorities into WHO's broader health strategies.
